▪ **Reading Tutorial (SED 435)** _____

Special Education certification candidates, some of whom may already hold a certification in a separate area, will administer a literacy screening assessment to your child and deliver a series of targeted phonics lesson to him/her over the course of the semester. Parents will receive a literacy screening report and a progress report to share with their child's school. Meeting times: once per week for approximately 4-6 one-hour sessions. Children are expected to attend every session. Absence and/or tardiness may result in your child being replaced by another student. Parent exit conference is required. Free. Send: Completed Application.

▪ **Reading Screening (RDG 567)** _____

Reading M.S. and 6th year candidates will administer a literacy screening assessment to your child in order to identify the specific grade level skills they are making adequate progress with, the specific grade level skills they would benefit from receiving some additional practice with in order to make adequate progress, and the specific grade level skills they would benefit from receiving more intensive supports with in order to make adequate progress. Parents will receive a literacy screening report to share with their child's school. Meeting times: one Saturday session per semester. Free. Send: Completed Application.

▪ **Reading Tutorial (RDG 659)** _____

Reading M.S. and 6th year candidates will administer a literacy screening assessment to your child and deliver a series of targeted lessons to him/her over the course of the semester. Parents will receive a case study report to share with their child's school. Meeting times: twice per week for approximately 15 one-hour sessions. Children are expected to attend every session. Absence and/or tardiness may result in your child being replaced by another student. Parent exit conference is required. Free. Send: Completed Application.

▪ **Reading Assessment (RDG 568)** _____

Reading M.S. and 6th year candidates will administer a comprehensive literacy assessment to your child. Parents will receive a diagnostic evaluation to share with their child's school. Meeting times: one per week for approximately 8 one-hour sessions. Children are expected to attend every session. Absence and/or tardiness may result in your child being replaced by another student. Parent exit conference is required. Free. Send: Completed Application and a Complete Copy of Your Child's Educational Record.

▪ **Learning Disability Assessment (SED 536)** _____

Special Education M.S. candidates will administer a comprehensive literacy assessment to your child. The focus of this clinic is assessment and remediation of reading disabilities, including Dyslexia. At least one certified special educator will be assigned to work with your child. Parents will receive a comprehensive diagnostic reading assessment to share with their child's school. Meeting times: once per week for approximately 3 1.5 hour sessions. Parent exit conference required. Free. Send: Completed Application and a Complete Copy of Your Child's Educational Record.

▪ **Learning Disability Clinic (SED 539)** _____

Special Education M.S. candidates will administer an instructional screening assessment to your child and provide individualized instructional interventions to your child that are based on the results of their screening assessment. This clinic is reserved for students already identified as Learning Disabled and who have an active Individualized Education Plan (IEP). Children are expected to attend every session. Absence and/or tardiness may result in your child being replaced by another student. Presently, this clinic is offered only in the summers. Parent exit conference is required.
